



Oxford University is the oldest university in the Englishspeaking world and remains an internationally-renowned centre of learning. Today, Oxford is a vibrant modern city with stunning medieval architecture. The university continues to attract the brightest students and most eminent academics from across the world.

The Oxford Advanced Studies Program (OASP) is held in Brasenose College, which is over 500 years old. Brasenose enjoys the best location of any Oxford University College, right in the heart of the historic city and next to the famous Bodleian Library and Radcliffe Camera. OASP classrooms are in the Frewin Annexe whilst the impressive college dining hall is located in the main college building.

All OASP students have a comfortable bedroom in the Frewin Court Annexe of Brasenose College. Frewin Court is a quiet and secure residential courtyard a short walk from the main college, next to the Oxford Union debating chambers.

Oxford's 'dreaming spires', cobbled streets and world-famous university provide a fantastic backdrop to our Oxford summer programme. As of 2018, 27 UK Prime Ministers have attended Oxford. International leaders from at least 30 other countries have also studied at Oxford, making it the ideal summer location for ambitious students.

The Cambridge Advanced Studies Program (CASP) is held in Magdalene College, founded in 1428 and the seventh oldest Cambridge University College. Located just north of the city centre on the River Cam it enjoys the longest riverfront of any college. Magdalene is famous for housing the diaries of Samuel Pepys, the writer who recorded the events of the Great Fire of London in 1666. Older, more traditional Magdalene buildings such as the famous Pepys Library are complemented by the new Cripps Court accommodation and teaching block.

Cambridge is a small, intimate city dominated by impressive university buildings. It is the perfect location for students wanting a traditional and academically inspiring summer programme. CASP students will follow in the footsteps of the 10 Kings and Queens, 53 Presidents and Prime Ministers, and 98 Nobel Prize winners who were all educated at Cambridge University.

The Oxford and Cambridge University teaching method is based on small-group seminars and one-to-one tutorials, and this experience also lies at the heart of our summer programmes.

This creates a lively and rewarding learning environment for all our students, who are encouraged to actively engage with new and exciting academic ideas. We also offer challenging projects, creative workshops and cultural excursions alongside a full activity programme in and around Cambridge and Oxford.

SEMINARS AND TUTORIALS

Small-group seminars introduce students to new ideas before encouraging lively discussions. Students study two subjects chosen from a varied and exciting selection which covers the Arts, Humanities and Social & Natural Sciences – the list of options can be found overleaf.

Students receive five one-hour seminars per week and one individual tutorial per fortnight in each of their chosen subjects. They may select a third subject upon arrival, dependent on their personal timetable.

Our student-centred approach offers a high degree of personal attention, student involvement and constructive appraisal of ideas. Students are expected to prepare work and ideas for each seminar and tutorial. Tutors will often set assignments or reading for the following day which will need to be done outside of class. Most tutors also recommend a reading list for students before arriving in the UK.

The Oxford and Cambridge Advanced Studies seminars and tutorials are designed to help students bridge the challenging gap between high school and college. Students are encouraged to approach new or familiar ideas from different and more mature perspectives than they would have come across at high school level. All levels of knowledge and experience are welcomed and our tutors grade the content appropriately.

WORKSHOPS, MASTER CLASSES AND SOCIAL PROGRAMME

A two-week course includes three afternoons of workshops and a final presentation by all students before the farewell dinner and graduation ceremony. Master classes take place over two afternoons per programme, and students have a choice of options to help with their personal development. Students will enjoy three full-day excursions and one half-day trip every two weeks. Remaining periods are filled with exciting social events in and around Cambridge and Oxford.

Students choose two subjects from the range of tutorial subjects offered. Students staying for four or six weeks may study the same subjects for the duration of the course or change after two weeks. Full course overviews and suggested reading can be found on the Bucksmore website.

Politics & International Relations

With the growth of globalisation few things have a bigger impact on our everyday lives than politics and international relations. As the universities of numerous British Prime Ministers, and also the almae maters of many other world leaders, Cambridge and Oxford are the ideal locations for this course. The course will introduce students to the theoretical background of international relations before examining historical topics and analysing the behaviour of states and international organisations. O

International Business Management

In today's rapidly developing globalised economy, it is imperative that future leaders of their generation learn how to transcend borders and adopt an international outlook. In this course, students will explore the issues affecting multinational companies in terms of finance, economics, human resources, organisational theory and marketing. It provides an excellent foundation in how such global enterprises run and paves the way for a degree in a similar subject, helping students build the skills they need to manage an international brand. • ©

Macro & Micro Economics

Now more than ever economic matters are crucial to our everyday lives. While microeconomics studies the economic behaviour of the individual unit, such as a person, household or individual firm, macroeconomics focuses on all of the units combined together and is the study of the system as a whole. This course introduces basic concepts and tools used in macroeconomics analysis such as the theory, measurement and determination of national income, budget deficits, national debt and exchange rates. O

Marketing & Advertising

As digital and social media merge with traditional communication methods, changing the way businesses operate, there really couldn't be a more exciting time to study marketing. In today's highly competitive global economy, effective marketing and advertising lie at the very heart of every successful business. Ranging from global marketing to brand and corporate communications, this course will help you develop essential career skills like critical analysis, creativity and problemsolving. • ©



International Law

This course provides an introduction to the rules and functions of international law by exploring the different areas it encompasses. The history of international law will be examined, to provide some context, before focusing on the more specific topics of the international protection of human rights, recognition, jurisdiction, the use of force, and the United Nations organs. This subject is ideal for those looking to study law at university and those with a general interest in these topics. • C

Psychology

The study of human behaviour has captured scientific minds ever since ancient Greek philosophers theorised that mental illnesses were of a physical, rather than divine nature. The study of psychology leads to a greater understanding of people and thus a background in psychology can boost your employability, whichever career path you choose to pursue. This tutorial covers key issues in social and cognitive psychology, nature vs. nurture, and psychological research methodology.



Foundations of Philosophy

Oxford University has educated and played host to some of the finest minds and biggest names in the history of philosophy, John Locke being but an example. The course will start from the very origins of philosophical thought, dating as far back as Aristotle and Plato, and will explore the basic principles of philosophy, before moving on to tackle some of the most intricate and fascinating questions which have troubled eminent philosophers in more recent years.

Philosophy in Literature

Many works of fiction explore themes centred around the nature and meaning of the human experience. This tutorial examines serious and thought-provoking philosophical issues that find their expression in the words of authors rather than in philosophy textbooks. A wide range of British, Continental and American authors across a spectrum of genres will be studied, focusing on topics such as the good and evil in the self, despair with redemption and meaninglessness and absurdity.

Creative Writing

The writer Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "There is creative reading as well as creative writing." We have taken these thoughts on board in our tutorial. Looking at the working methods of successful traditional and contemporary authors, students build up a writing 'tool kit' of their own. Students produce their own work, both in groups and individually, putting what they have learned into practice with verse, prose or drama. This is the perfect tutorial for students with a passion for literature and a fervid imagination. ©

Contemporary Literature

Looking at works published after the end of the Second World War, students will step into the shoes of a variety of authors from the modern era. Examining the wide variety of themes and settings explored by these authors, students will reflect on how different political and societal viewpoints are shown in the characters and writings styles of these works, as well as how these have changed over time. This is a great course for students with a passion for literature or recent history.

Classical Literature

Studying texts predating 1914 provides students with the opportunity to understand the cultural and historical context of various time periods that shaped the art emerging from its era. From Beowulf to The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, classical literature has provided inspiration to generations of writers and thinkers over the years.



History of Art

Since time immemorial, art in all its forms has been used to convey feelings and aspects of human life: from religion, to science, to ideals of beauty and beyond. This course will examine how art has changed over time and what it can teach us about the past, encouraging students to analyse and evaluate art works. •

Social Studies

Social studies is the integrated study of multiple fields of social science and the humanities, including history, geography, anthropology and political science. The course allows students to study the history of social interaction between and within nations whilst developing the ability to make informed and reasoned decisions for the public good as culturally diverse and democratic citizens in an independent world. This is an ideal course for students looking to study a humanities degree including PPE at Oxford or HSPS at Cambridge.





Film Studies

From Charlie Chaplin to Avatar, 'moving pictures' have been entertaining audiences for over a century. The growth of Film Studies as an academic discipline testifies to the importance of examining films not only as a cultural artefact, but also as an influential art form. Looking at films from a range of directors, genres and time periods, this course provides an introduction to film history, theory and criticism, perfect for those with a passion for the silver screen.

Applications of Engineering

As Albert Einstein put it, "Scientists investigate that which already is; engineers create that which has never been." Engineering is an extremely broad field of study, embracing everything from electronics to space exploration. This tutorial will provide students with an overview of the practical applications of engineering in different fields including electrical and mechanical, and will offer the opportunity for some hands-on design and experimentation. This course is the perfect partner to our mathematics and science tutorials. O O

Physics

Physics is one of the oldest academic disciplines, tracing its origins back two millennia when astrologers tried to explain the world around them by gazing at the stars. Since then classic physicists, including paradigm-shifting Cambridge graduate Isaac Newton, have changed the manner in which we understand the world. This course covers the major breakthroughs in classic physics, beginning with Newton. Students will gain a foundation in areas of modern physics including relativity, quantum mechanics and cosmology. ©

Architecture

Every year, millions of tourists are awestruck by the architectural masterpiece of Oxford's city centre. What better backdrop for students who are looking to embark upon their journey of becoming a qualified architect? This course will introduce the basics of design and implementation, as well as exploring some of the historical and cultural issues that influence the field. O

Chemistry


Chemistry concerns itself with atoms and the ways in which these interact to form chemical bonds. After a comprehensive review of the atomic structure, the amount of substance and bonding principles, students will learn the foundations of organic chemistry and will explore some of the more practical applications of chemistry, including energetics, kinetics and equilibria. This is an ideal course for students looking to study chemistry at degree level, although this is not a pre-requisite. ©

Medicine

On the course, you will gain an overview of the workings of the nervous and immune systems, both having profound implications for human health. This will help you examine the arguments of nature versus nurture for the causes of some 'modern' diseases such as heart disease and diabetes. This is an ideal course for students wishing to study medicine, or for those with an interest in the issues surrounding our future health. O ©

Advanced Mathematics

For those wanting to further their knowledge in one of the most essential subjects that affects a multitude of fields, this advanced mathematics course looks at various areas of algebra, calculus, probability and statistics, complex numbers, defining the derivative, the definite integral and a study of differential and integral calculus. ©

Each week, a dynamic visiting lecturer is invited to inspire students and help enrich their experience on the Advanced Studies Programme. The guest lecturers come from a variety of backgrounds, including Oxbridge professors and industry experts.





WORKSHOPS



The Oxford and Cambridge Advanced Studies Program offers a well-rounded academic and social experience. Students need to have a creative output as well as developing academic skills. A range of workshops are available:

Entrepreneurship

Students have a chance to embrace their entrepreneurial skills by identifying a product or service that they could turn into a business. They will develop a coherent business plan as well as an elevator pitch.



Journalism

Students are introduced to a variety of journalistic techniques, such as television, radio and printed copy; before being challenged to produce their own materials in the style of their chosen medium.

Film Production

Students interested in the different aspects of film making and production are given guidance on the basic methods and techniques involved, working towards the production of short films on topics chosen by the group.

Drama

For those with dramatic flair, this is the ideal workshop to release it. No previous experience is required, although enthusiasm and creativity are essential. Ideal for both novice thespians and matinee idols. Previous weekly workshops have ranged from Shakespeare to stage combat and improvisation classes.



Urban Sketching

Armed with a sketchbook and graphite pencils, students are tasked with capturing the beauty of Oxford and Cambridge's world-famous architecture by visiting historical colleges and castles in the area, led by a counsellor with a background in art.

Debating

Both Cambridge and Oxford University are renowned for their debating pedigree. A range of public figures from Ronald Reagan to the Dalai Lama have spoken at the world-famous Oxford and Cambridge Unions. Students will be coached in the art of constructing coherent arguments and will partake in a formal debate.

MASTER CLASSES



In addition to workshops, master classes take place on two afternoons per two-week programme. These sessions explore key skills essential for success in further education and future careers. A range of master classes are available:

SAT Preparation

Providing students with an introduction to a variety of techniques allows an improved level of preparation before taking the test, in order to help maximise their score.

Introduction to UCAS

The UK's 'Universities and Colleges Admissions Service' can be a daunting prospect to international students at first. These master classes introduce the organisation to help give students a better understanding of its use.

Personal Statements

Writing a personal statement can be an integral part of a student's university application process, and these classes will help students to boost the quality of their submission.

Interview Skills

Preparation is the key ingredient for interview success. Adhering to a few tips and tricks when planning for an interview can provide improved results.

Presentation Skills

The ability to give a professional and effective presentation can be a huge advantage. Students will learn a selection of methods to help them present and communicate in a variety of circumstances.

Essay Writing Skills

Essays provide students with an opportunity to shine. These sessions will give students guidance on developing arguments, syntax and tone.

Study Skills

The amount of independent learning at university can be a shock to new system. Learning proper note taking, revision and how to survive lectures can give a head start when the first day of higher education finally comes.

IELTS Preparation

For non-native speakers on the Advanced Studies Programme, achieving the highest possible IELTS score can be a priority. These sessions will help students understand different possible approaches to help with this.

UK Undergraduate Experience

An opportunity to speak to Oxford and Cambridge University undergraduates about their Oxbridge experience, including the application process and life at two of the most famous institutions in the world.

How to Choose a Degree

This class aims to provide students with a clearer idea of how to match their interests and aspirations to subject disciplines.

SOCIAL PROGRAMME AND EXCURSIONS





The Oxford and Cambridge Advanced Studies Program is not just about academics. A full calendar of visits and activities is an integral part of the course. Oxford and Cambridge are fantastic cities to spend a summer in and our social programme is the perfect opportunity to meet and make friends with fellow students from all over the world.



Around Oxford and Cambridge

Besides being world-renowned for the calibre and prestige of their universities, Oxford and Cambridge are also two of the most popular sightseeing destinations in the UK. Students are taken on orientation tours around the cities and colleges at the beginning of the course and can explore these world-famous locations in depth during their stay. OASP students can explore the Bodleian Library, Ashmolean Museum and Christ Church College where the Harry Potter movies were filmed. CASP students will enjoy the Fitzwilliam Museum, King's College Chapel or a quiet walk through Granchester Meadows along the River Cam. Both Oxford and Cambridge are well-known for punting which is a fantastic way to spend a sunny summer day. Local Shakespeare productions are often performed in beautiful college gardens, offering a delightful experience for any student.







Excursions


Every fortnight includes three full-day excursions and one half-day trip to exciting locations across the UK, including at least one visit to London. Other destinations include:

- Blenheim Palace
- Ely & Ely Cathedral
- Stratford-upon-Avon
- Windsor Castle & Eton
- Warwick Castle
- Stonehenge & Bath

Students will also enjoy academically-relevant visits to local businesses, museums and other cultural highlights of the UK. In addition, tutors are encouraged to take their students on field trips linked to their lessons.

Students are allowed to sign out of college during set periods. OASP and CASP students are older teenagers so they are trusted to explore the cities with their new friends. They must always be with at least one other student and stick to strict curfews.





Evening

In the evening, students can relax after a busy day. We offer a range of activities in Oxford and Cambridge – from bowling to cinema to restaurant visits – although some students prefer to stay in college and prepare for the workshops or seminars.

Whatever their preference, CASP and OASP provide full social programmes that cater for all students' needs and expectations. The programmes provide a full immersion into British culture and are designed to ensure our students have as much fun as possible during the summer.





King's College London is a prestigious university in the heart of the capital and the ideal location for our London Advanced Studies Programme. It is consistently ranked among the top universities in both the UK and the world. Lessons take place on the Strand campus, a ten minute walk from Trafalgar Square, the centre of London.

LASP places students in the centre of London, lessons take place at King's College London's Strand campus, with a maximum class size of six students. Meals are also taken at the Strand campus, which is just across the River Thames from their accommodation at Conway Hall provided by the University of Notre Dame. Consisting of recently refurbished modern bedrooms, students have a short walk across Waterloo Bridge to their lessons, taking in the famous sights of the London Eye and the Houses of Parliament on their way.

Founded in 1829 by King George IV and the Duke of Wellington, King's College has played a major part in 19th-century science and in educating women and working men through evening university classes. Florence Nightingale, John Keats and Desmond Tutu are a few of these notable alumni.

The London Advanced Studies Programme (LASP) allows younger students, aged 13-16, to experience a prestigious academic summer school. Based at the world-renowned King's College London, this course aimed at native and high-level English speakers offers a range of academic subjects to aid and prepare students for their future.



The London Advanced Studies Programme (LASP) aims to bridge the gap between basic high school content and the more challenging syllabi of A-level and IB programmes.

The course has been adapted for younger students from the successful model of CASP and OASP, and combines small group tuition with a fun and engaging social programme with students on our Bucksmore London course.

King's College London, is the ideal location for this programme. Located in the centre of London, only a 10 minute walk from Trafalgar Square, the university has consistently ranked in the top 10 for UK Universities and the top 100 for Universities globally, and is one of the oldest universities in England, after Oxford and Cambridge.

Accommodation is provided by the University of Notre Dame, a short walk across Waterloo Bridge over the River Thames. Students live in shared apartments with twin and triple bedrooms; shared kitchens, bathrooms and living area.

Teaching

Small-group seminars introduce students to new ideas before encouraging lively discussions. Students study one core subject and one specialist subject chosen from a varied and exciting selection which includes Humanities and Social & Natural Sciences – the full list of options can be found overleaf.

WEEK TWO

CORE SUBJECTS

Students on the London Advanced Studies Program choose one 'core' and one 'specialist' subject to study each week. Taught by external academic tutors, core subjects are studied over 10 hours each week, in addition to 5 hours of specialist subject tuition. Students must choose their subjects prior to arrival and may study a different core and specialist subject per each two weeks of their stay.



Biochemistry

Comprehending the foundations of chemistry are fundamental to gaining an understanding of how life is constructed. Chemical bonds, atomic structures and equilibria all have a part to play.

Business Studies

Fancy yourself as the next Bill Gates? In order to mould the minds of future CEOs, these sessions will take a look at areas such as marketing strategy, types of organisations, finance, ethical issues and supply chain analysis.

Psychology of the Mind

Comprehending the foundations of the human brain is a captivating way to understand how people think. Learn about the main themes and schools of thought that form the basis of psychology and behavioural science.

Physics of the Universe

The study of space has enchanted man since the dawn of time. Our Sun is 1,300,000 times bigger than Earth, yet the Sun is 300 times smaller than the largest known star. Ever felt so small?

IELTS Preparation

IELTS is recognised globally, giving students a truly international qualification. With specialist tuition, including exam techniques and tips to help improve overall test performance, students will finish the course with the necessary skills to maximise their IELTS performance.

Marvels of Mathematics

From calculus to trigonometry, mathematics is the core of all scientific understanding. Statistics, shapes and scales are all studied in this advanced look at the first subject ever studied by mankind.

English Literature

Since the epic poem *Beowulf*, fiction has long been a part of UK culture. From *Oliver Twist* to *Harry Potter*, step in to the absorbing world of English literature. Critiquing themes, creating characterization and analysing prose are all explored on this course.



SPECIALIST SUBJECTS

In addition to core subjects, students choose one of the following subjects to be studied over 5 hours per week:

Physical Geography

A branch of natural science that examines the planet's many environments, Physical Geography challenges students to understand Earth's abundance of processes and patterns that has created the world we live in today.

British History

Since William the Conqueror led the Norman occupation in 1066, Britain has had 40 kings and queens, invaded almost 90% of the world's countries, and gained and lost an empire. These tutorials study the key turning points in British history.

Feeling Philosophical

Socrates said 'I cannot teach anybody anything, I can only make them think'. Reflection can be one of the most difficult skills for any person to master. Journey into the world of musing, brooding and philosophy in these profound sessions that allow students to contemplate their own existence.

Robotics


A future with robots as part of everyday life is becoming more and more of a reality. Students can develop knowledge and skills in the field of robotics through a combination of theoretical studies and practical work with construction kits.

Macro and Micro Fconomics

Now more than ever economic matters are crucial to our everyday lives. While microeconomics studies the economic behaviour of the individual unit, such as a person, household or individual firm, macroeconomics focuses on all of the units combined together and is the study of the system as a whole. This course introduces basic concepts and tools used in macroeconomics analysis such as the theory, measurement and determination of national income, budget deficits, national debt and exchange rates.

Introduction to Law

Ideal for any student considering a possible career in law, this course will introduce the application of law in the courtroom, as well as the fundamental principles to legal systems, legislature and the formation of laws.



PROJECTS

Once a week, students develop their project management skills through teamwork based exercises.

UK Capital of Culture

Research, design and presentation are the key skills employed in this project. Working in groups, students research and market a UK city to be advertised to an international audience.

Theatre Production

This project focuses on script-writing, directing and costume design.
Students produce short plays and perform on stage in front of their peers.

Technology Expo

Communication and innovation are developed through designing a new technologically based product. Students design and create an exhibition based on their market research to launch their 'new & original' product.

Bucksmore Elections

Centred-round an election campaign, students produce manifestos, posters and give campaign speeches to their peers. The week's project culminates with members of the winning party voted in as class president and vice-president.

SOCIAL PROGRAMME AND EXCURSIONS

The London Advanced Studies Program has a combined activities and excursions itinerary with students on the Bucksmore London course. The timetable is planned and organised by a dedicated Activity Manager, who is responsible for choosing and coordinating weekly activities and excursions. A key responsibility of an Activity Manager is to respond to student requests and ensure that all students have a fantastic time during their stay.



Excursions

Students are welcomed with a walking tour around London to orientate themselves with their surroundings. Throughout each week, students go on excursions around London visiting iconic famous landmarks such as Big Ben and Buckingham Palace. To give students a true insight into London, they visit different parts of London that are not as well known, such as Covent Garden, the British Museum, the National Gallery, Camden Town, the Natural History Museum and of course shopping along Oxford Street!

Sport and Evenings

After a busy day, students can take part in sporting activities during various afternoons throughout the week.

From capture the flag in Hyde Park to colour wars, students have team games available to let off some steam!

Alternatively, after a busy day, students can relax with various activities such as a meal in Chinatown or an evening on the Southbank next to the River Thames.

Live London!

Our social programme makes the most of our students' stay in central London. We organise at least seven visits to London attractions over a two-week stay – from famous destinations to lesser known sights – to allow students to experience life as a true Londoner.







STUDENT WELFARE

We also offer free transfers from St. Pancras International rail station to CASP, UKUP & LASP, and from Stansted airport to CASP & UKUP. Students arriving directly to the centre should also notify us of an arrival time so Bucksmore staff are expecting them.


